RE-MEMBERING

To dismember is to break or tear apart - to re-member is to bring together. And remembering, or bringing together, is what many will be doing, in a special way this year at 11am on 11th November, as we recall the ending of the First World War at that time on that day 100 years ago. Many special services and events have been arranged, but soon that date will be just one more memorable date in the history of the world.



Now 100 years on, in the world for which so many fought and died in the hope of peace, wars and conflicts continue to erupt. We ask 'Why do we still go on killing and injuring one another?' And sometimes 'Why does God allow there to be so much slaughter and bloodshed?'

I don't believe that it's ever God's will that human beings should fight, maim and kill one another or that there should be enmity, hatred and division between people and nations. I believe that God's will for us is always 'Shalom', that ancient Jewish word which means, Peace and yet so much more than peace. God longs for human beings to live together in peace and harmony, and when things go wrong to restore all things through Jesus Christ. Always God wants us live together as sisters and brothers in one family, and like a loving parent, he doesn't impose his will on us. He allows us freely to choose how we react and respond to each other, especially when we feel we've been badly treated, offended or injured.

So, when we bewail, as we often do, the number of conflicts and acts of terrorism in our world today, let each of us take a moment to think about our own situation; our neighbours, our community and yes, our church congregations and ask ourselves:

'Am I living in peace and harmony within them?'

'Am I quick to take offence?'

'Am I always on the look out to find fault with someone I find difficult?'

'Am I still holding a grudge against someone many years after an incident?'

'Am I still seething with resentment at someone who did me harm and hoping they'll get their come-uppance one day?'

Think of the meaning of 're-membering' and let this year's blood-red poppies, be more than a poignant symbol of remembrance of those who died. Let them also be a means of bringing us together, of inspiring us to let go of present anger and old resentments and bitterness, truly to forgive and to be at peace with one another. And, because this is something we really find hard to do, let's determine to ask God to give us the grace we need to enable us to do it.



It is hoped that as many people as possible will be able to join in the Battle's Over service to mark the conclusion of the first World War and to pay tribute to those in our parishes who played their part, whether at home or abroad, military or civilian.



Marcus' Muse

The Remembrance Sunday service has always been important to me. My earliest memory is the proud feeling of seeing my dad smart in his Coastguard uniform laying a wreath and knowing too that he had served in the navy. I was once called before the head teacher accused of scattering the wreaths around the cenotaph area when in fact I was trying to replace them to their proper places but there were so many misplaced and I was late for school. I have paraded over the years in different uniforms and rather extreme weather conditions (or so it felt) at times. The most poignant though was in Northern Ireland; I was returning from a parade as a sea cadet only to hear of a bombing at the Enniskillen remembrance parade in which 12 people died and many injured. I thought then that the act of remembering those who have been killed by war has to be about remembering the value of life in each and every person and until we can do that, people will always be at war somewhere.

Another of my earliest memories is of being transfixed by a record cover of military music. On it was a First World War battle scene and in the middle was a soldier carrying the colours and a bagpipe player; neither had guns but both were an important part of the advancement. This pictured formed my image of bravery and gave me a love for the sound of the bagpipes.

On 11th November the United Kingdom and its friends overseas will mark the day 100 years ago when the guns fell silent at the end of the First World War.
