Welcoming our new Assistant Curates!

This June, we will be really delighted to welcome our new curates Revd Rose Jones and Revd Geraldine Ashton. They will both be ordained as deacons at Truro Cathedral on Friday 28th June at 7.30pm, along with Lee Chantler, Jeffrey Terry and Fiona Giorla, who are all known to us in the Cluster.

Geraldine and Rose's first service in the Cluster as ordained ministers will be the communion service at St Kew at 9.30am on Sunday 30th June, and we will be having a welcome lunch for them both at St Kew Parish Hall at 12.30pm the same day. Please do come along to meet and congratulate them!

During their curacies (which last 3-4 years) Rose and Geraldine will be learning as they do the work of ordained ministry, and you are likely to see them accompanying me on visits and in services. They will also attend training with the other curates in the diocese, but they will spend most of their time in the Cluster. Rose will be a full-time curate, training to become a Parish Priest or Chaplain in the future, and Geraldine will be a part-time curate, training for the role of Associate Priest, similar to the role that Judith and Andrew have previously carried out in our Cluster.

Geraldine and Rose will be ordained as deacons for the first year of their curacy. During this year they will be able to take baptisms, funerals and non-eucharistic services, as well as preaching and getting involved in mission and pastoral care. Next summer, we expect that they will be ordained as priests, and then they will begin to take weddings and communion services as well.

Rose and Geraldine begin their time with us as curates with a great many gifts and skills which will enrich and inspire us. We already know Geraldine well, and look forward to getting to know Rose when she arrives. I hope that all of us will continue to support and uphold them, and their families, in prayer as they are ordained and throughout their time with us. I thank God for calling them both to journey with us and look forward to all that God will do through them in our churches and communities.



Third Sunday in June – Father's Day. Father's Day was first suggested in 1909 by a lady in Washington, USA, in appreciation of her own father, and in direct imitation of the new Mother's Day, which was beginning to gain support at the time. Although taking time to catch on, it was finally recognized by a joint resolution of Congress in 1956, and received Presidential support in 1966 and 1972. Father's Day entered British popular culture in the wake of Mother's Day sometime after the Second World War. Some say it is a card-day too far.

29th June. St Peter's Day/St Paul's Day. Considering the pre-eminence of St Peter and Paul in early history, and their continued popularity ever since, it might seem strange that no particular festivals and few customs have been recorded for this day. However, it seems they were simply too close to Midsummer's Day and St John the Baptist's Day, on 24 June, to acquire many customs of their own, and instead became incorporated into a midsummer festival season that lasted until the end of the month. In some areas it was said that the weather on St Peter's Day was crucial to the apple crop. According to an 1886 Herefordshire saying: Unless the apples are christened on St Peter's Day the crop will not be good; and there ought to be a shower of rain when the people will go through the orchards, but no one seems to know for what purpose.
