Living out our faith

The earliest Christians were known for the way that they lived – sharing love and resources so generously that others noticed what they were doing and thought that they should do the same. One of the challenges for us as Christians today is to live out our faith - as individuals and as church communities - in ways that demonstrate God's love for all. But how do we do that, every day?

The first disciples met together to share fellowship and learn from the teaching of those who had known Jesus personally. They broke bread together, prayed together, and shared their resources with one another, serving those in need. They worshipped and ate together with glad and generous hearts, and as they did this people joined them. They made new disciples, and the church grew. (Acts 2.42-47)



This description of how the earliest Christians lived out their faith can be a model for us as we seek to grow in our own faith living today. There is a new discipleship programme, which we are considering following in our Cluster, which is based on doing exactly this. It is called "Holy Habits" and the idea is that church communities seek to develop each of ten holy habits, drawn from this description in Acts, by focussing on one habit at a time in a whole range of ways.

Holy Habits provides resources for our worship and preaching, for small groups and for individuals to explore each habit, and seek to develop it. Whether it is "Eating Together" or "Prayer", "Gladness and Generosity" or "Serving", each holy habit enables us to grow a little more in our faith living.

We will be considering this way of growing in our discipleship in our Cluster this month, and I hope that we will all be able to deepen our faith as we seek to live our lives God's way, in love and joy and peace.

Avila Wild volunteering in Tanzania!

Having just finished my A-levels and now embarking on a gap year before university, I'm really excited to tell you that I have been selected to volunteer in Tanzania this October with Raleigh International on an ICS (International Citizen Service) placement. ICS volunteers live and work alongside local youth volunteers fighting poverty together. Every overseas community, that ICS volunteers work with, has specifically asked for the energy and enthusiasm of youth volunteers and all ICS projects are committed to delivering real impact on the ground. ICS also aims to inspire young people in the UK and overseas to become active citizens who are passionate about long term community development. Half the world is under the age of 25 and by empowering young people ICS believes they will bring about positive change worldwide.



The first part of my placement is a challenge to raise £800 towards the work of Raleigh International and their ICS partners. The money raised will go towards enabling the overall costs of ICS, ensuring they can continue sending youth volunteers, like me, to the developing world to make a lasting difference in disadvantaged communities. I'm planning to raise part of this amount by undertaking a sponsored walk around all six of the beautiful churches in our cluster in one day, although the final date is tbc it will be sometime in July and anyone is welcome to join me and my friends walking from one church to the next or even all six if they would like! Experience Harvest

It might feel a little early to be thinking of harvest especial when we are hoping for the right quantities of sunshine and gentle rain this summer, but we have exciting and big plans for this harvest season; also I shall away for two weeks in September so I really need to complete all my plans before then!

It will be run on four different days and we need 5 helpers to lead the stations; please see me if you would like to help on one of these afternoons. To complete the experience, each station will be decorated according to its' theme and a makeshift "booth" to be the final tabernacle. If you have any paraphernalia that might help towards one of the themes and are willing to loan it to us or if you know how to build a Sukkah please do get in touch with me before September.

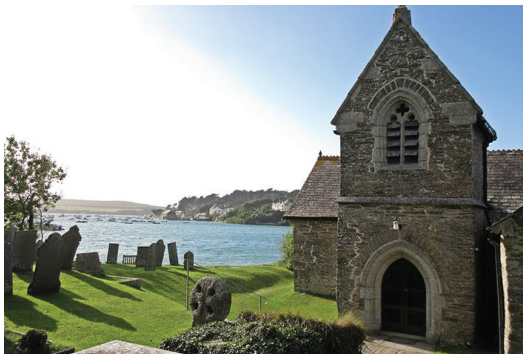


A Sukkah; this year Sukkot starts on 13th Oct

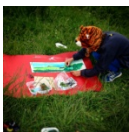
