St Pol de Léon church

On Televisions "Songs of Praise" on Sunday 6th September one hymn was sung in St Pol de Léon church at Penzance. Intrigued by the church name I looked up several sources.

St Pol de Léon church is on Mousehole Lane, in the parish of Paul, Penzance, founded in the 15th century; first recorded in 1259. The medieval dedication was to St Paul the Apostle but may have referred to two other saints; most historians favour St Paulinus of York (Feast Day 10th October) while local tradition favours a Welshman St Paul Aurelian. Allegedly, Paul Aurelian was a son of a chieftain of Britain and educated at the monastery of St Illtyd. He became a monk and priest, and with 12 missionary companions migrated to Brittany where they founded a number of churches, became a bishop, and died aged 140 in AD 575 on the Isle of Batz off the coast of Brittany. On this part of the French coast, in the Finistére region, near Roscoff, there is a nearby church dedicated in 1297 to Paul Aurelian in the village Pol-de-Léon. This village is also famous for its 13th century cathedral. Seen on websites for both churches there are beautiful stained glass images of Saint Paulus-de-Léon. Well worth a visit sometime?
