



Fellowship of the barn

Tolkien's epic trilogy begins with the book "Fellowship of the Ring", a tale of four hobbits (who's natural habitat is a quiet and peaceful shire) on a perilous journey accompanied by two men, an elf, a dwarf and a wizard. The company would in any other circumstance be unlikely fellows but as they sojourn through forests, over mountains and in caves of the deep, they discover their need for each other and as they learn the stories they each carry and as they face enemies together, they develop a deep friendship for each other. Legolas the elf and Gimli the dwarf built a particularly strong bond despite the prejudices long held by their own people.

Advent is the time when we put up little models of barns in our homes and churches, and we will send pictures of people associated with that barn to each other. We will sing (covid securely) carols and for a short time we will hold together an image of shepherds, magi, angels, cows and sheep, and a young family surrounding in awe the new born baby.

It is unlikely that the fellowship of the barn were actually all together that first night but that is not the truth that our nativity set are pointing to. The local farm labourers and the foreign aristocrats have heard the message of God and they respond with worship for the Christ in

the humble dwelling place of animals.

Our nativity scene is so that we can see ourselves included in fellowship at this miraculous moment of God becoming like one of us to be among and with us whether you be the shepherd, the wise person, the young family or even the sheep or old cow, God is delighted to be with you.

The challenge of the nativity set is for us to allow others- no matter how different they may be- to stand or kneel beside us in fellowship and to worship in a manner fitting to their own customs. The fellowship that God draws us to, is more than one where we share the same space, but a fellowship that travels together through beauty and adversary; a fellowship to learn of each others' stories and a fellowship to aid and to be aided. Fellowship of the barn is how we live the nativity scene day by day and week by week.


