Holy Habits - Breaking Bread

As Holy Week and Easter approach, it seems at once very natural and very unnatural to be thinking about breaking bread. Natural because in our prayers and readings we are journeying with Jesus on the road to Jerusalem: like his disciples, we burst through the glorious Palm Sunday gates, wait huddled in the dark garden of Gethsemane, weep at the foot of the cross with his mother. In Holy Week we re-live Christ's passion, receiving broken bread from his hands and hearing his gentle voice remind us that it is his broken body.

Yet it is also unnatural, because this year of all years, we are unable to participate in Holy Week, and particularly in the Eucharist, as we normally would. Our ancient, solemn rituals have become new and jarring. At the time we most need the comfort of this familiar journey, we are left feeling abandoned.

It is precisely in this unnaturalness, this dislocation, that we can find connection. This year we, the Body of Christ, approach Holy Week full of brokenness. This year we come bearing the wounds of the world. This year we ourselves feel the wrenching and tearing of Christ's passion; it is we who are broken.

But like Christ, like the bread torn in the Last Supper, this brokenness is not futile. Nothing is wasted: no tear, no sleepless night, no bitter prayer. God takes us, broken and torn as we are, and shares us with, and for, the world. As we come to Christ this Easter, let us bring our heaviness, our bruised spirits, our heartache; let us touch our scars to his, and be reminded of the unceasing, soul-quenching life God has wrought from those wounds. We, too, can be beacons of God's hope in a hopeless world. We, too, can witness to the boundless joy of resurrection at work in and through our pain. We too can find new life in brokenness.



fundamental questions about what it means to be human; to love and be loved; to be true to ourselves and faithful to God. Yet we often struggle to talk about them: we can feel shame, fear or uncertainty about how others will perceive us. Some of us have had painful experiences in the past, and are wary of opening up to others and risk being misunderstood or condemned. Knowing there is division and disagreement amongst Christians about these topics, we sometimes wish simply to avoid controversy.

To help us think about these important questions, the Church of England has produced a specially-designed small group course, Living in Love and Faith. The five-session course helps us look at changes in society, different understandings of scripture and tradition, and hear real-life stories from a variety of perspectives. It is carefully and gently put together to help us explore, share, learn and listen to one another and, most importantly, to God. At the end of our conversations we will have a chance to feedback our thoughts to the House of Bishops, who will be making important decisions about these issues. This is an opportunity both to contribute to the national conversation, and also to grow as Christians and a church community. Whether you have thought about these questions a lot or not at all, you are warmly invited to join us.

SLOW RETURN

As I write this in March we are preparing to resume public worship in our churches on Sunday, Mothering Sunday. It has been a long wait since just after Christmas! It is even longer since the middle of March 2020 when the first lockdown began. We have learned a lot in this time. We have been sustained by the remarkable availability of on-line worship. We have also perhaps learned that for those housebound by age or condition, this has been a time when they have been able to share once again in community worship. The possibility



of receiving home communion in normal times does not quite bring the same sense of involvement. As we return, we may hope permanently, to public worship in our churches we will need to continue to sustain the worship life of those who are not able to be join us in person.

At the same time we have become more aware, perhaps, of the power of private prayer as we have sought to replace regular church-going and other community exercises within the confines of our own homes. It is well to remember that since the earliest days of the church there have been those who have sought solitude and isolation, either individually or communally, as a means of deepening their spiritual experience. Whilst a life cut off from normal human exchanges and experiences is not for all, there is something to be said for an occasional exposure to the contemplative life, removed from the daily and other distractions to which we are usually subject. There is a value in doing this voluntarily rather than under compulsion but lockdown has nevertheless given us a taste of the experience.

One possible topic of contemplation during these long months has been the state of the world around us. We may have become more aware of nature, in the birds and hedgerows and in the relative lack of insect life. Once the immediate effects of the pandemic ease we will need as a society to engage more seriously with the problem of global warming and its attendant consequences. We may find that the measures necessary to combat this crisis much more intrusive upon our accustomed way of life and much more long-lasting than the pandemic has been.
