On the Way: Fruitfulness

Imagine a group of people who are so deeply loving of one another that other people cannot but be impressed by the fellowship which they share and offer to others. Imagine that these people are alive with a powerful relationship to the God of love and growing in faith in what they do and say in all of their lives.

Imagine that these people are committed as a community to making a difference in the lives of those who are the most vulnerable in society, working to combat poverty in a whole range of ways. Imagine that this group was made up of people of all ages, all excited to learn more about the God who loves them and the world we all share.

Imagine that these people were building relationships with other people of faith all over the world, being enriched by them and offering prayer and support to them in their circumstances. Imagine that they were passionate about caring for the environment in their daily life and through their involvement in community projects and campaigns.

If you can imagine all of this, you are imagining what our Bishops would call a “fruitful” church. This is a church, a group of people – whose relationships with God, with one another, with the wider community and indeed the wider world, including the natural world – are marked by love.

Their love for God and their desire to know Jesus and be filled by the Holy Spirit is growing and overflowing. They treat one another with such deep kindness and care that they feel this love in the whole community of the church. But more than that, their love extends beyond their fellow church members to those in need, to the young, to those living in far flung parts of the world, even to those fragile ecosystems of our natural environment which need so much care.

A “fruitful” church is one which is like an engine of love that overflows. The love that God generates among people of faith who join together is magnified until it spills over into all these relationships. People no longer think of themselves, because they know they are loved and cared for, instead they think of the needs of others. And these thoughts lead to prayer and action which makes a difference.

As we go “On the Way” as a Deanery and a Diocese, I wonder where we can see this kind of fruitfulness?
